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THE GREATEST LOVE

Have you ever wondered how Valentine's Day ever became a cultural holiday?

Well, it seems it dates as far back as 1350 in England. It was observed that birds began to pair and mate around the feast of St. Valentine (which was the day he died), the middle of February, and this gave rise to a cultural celebration of romantic love, which then the great father of English literature Geoffrey Chaucer captured in poetry and now is expressed in heart-covered cards, boxes of chocolates and jewelry.


But, as a matter of fact, St. Valentine was no Romeo. The association of chocolates and pink and red greeting cards has no intrinsic source in his character or life. He was in fact a priest in Rome in the third century who assisted martyrs during the persecution under Emperor Claudius II. Valentine was eventually arrested, beaten and beheaded around 270 C.E.¹ It was not in offering trite symbols of affection to God, but quite literally his heart, that proved he was a devotee to the greatest Lover of our souls embodied in Jesus Christ. Valentine took to heart Jesus' words, "No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends" (John 15:13).

Valentine's Day understood through the lens of Jesus' words then means much more than sappy sentimentalism. It serves to remind us of God's love that is so great that Christians over the centuries have dedicated themselves to proclaim and live it, even at the risk of literally losing their lives.

This year, four days after Valentine's Day we begin Lent (the forty days leading up to Easter, excluding Sundays) with Ash Wednesday. This season stands as a reminder that nothing lasts forever, not even these mortal bodies that cling so close, not even our greatest declarations of love. We are, after all, dust and to dust we shall return. What does last forever is God's love for us and the world and we know this because God gave us his only son, a love so great that not even death could defeat it.

So, I encourage you to reflect on the greatest love of all this Valentine's Day as you prepare to follow Jesus Christ, the greatest Lover of our souls, to the Cross and his glorious resurrection.

JOURNEY INTO LENT

The season of Lent is a time of prayer, fasting and self-examination in preparation for the celebration of the resurrection of the Lord at Easter. It is a period of 40 days – like the flood of Genesis, Moses' sojourn at Mount Sinai, Elijah's journey to Mount Horeb, Jonah's call to Ninevah to repent and Jesus' time of testing in the wilderness. (The Sundays in Lent are not counted in this reckoning of the time between Ash Wednesday and Easter, as every Lord's Day is a celebration of the resurrection of Jesus Christ.) Throughout this edition of the *TORCH* look for ways you and your families can journey together through these forty days.

“MS. GOODE, WHY IS IT CALLED GODLY PLAY?”

For twelve years, the Montessori-based Godly Play approach to religious education has been incorporated into children's Sunday School. With the passing of time, words and titles often taken for granted require a little thought and explanation. Often those occasions are called to our attention by children, and then followed by adults thinking, “Good question! I never really thought about that!” Not long ago, during a Godly Play presentation in Sunday School, a child asked about that now-familiar term, “Godly Play”. Why is it called Godly Play?

On the surface, those words used together may sound disrespectful and irreverent! But then, one must look a little more deeply at the meaning of the word “play”.

We have to know what “play” is and isn't. Play involves doing for the sake of doing, not having a goal or a specific outcome. Play cannot be forced on anyone. Play isn't random; it has structure.

Play is called “the work of the child”. It IS work! It isn't childish; it isn't silly. Play is important and serious, but also joyful. Adults can play, too, but have to make a conscious effort to let go of goals, to invite joy, to just be in the moment and the process. Play comes natural to children.

In Godly Play, there is an entering with joy, reverence, and a huge sense of play into the wonder of the stories of God and the religious language that we use to worship God.

Jesus tells us we must become like children. In play at experiencing God, we do just that and can reap benefits that no one but God knows, outcomes we do not plan nor anticipate, outcomes that can surprise us and even make us laugh with joy!

Of course, that is the explanation for adults. When children ask “Why is it called Godly Play?”, we can tell them: When we play, we are doing something serious, but it's not for a grade or to see who wins. Playing to win is called a competition. In Godly Play, we play to play. Play is a kind of work. We are serious, but we are happy. In Godly Play, we are playing with Godly things: God's stories, the words of worship, and the words of prayer.

Begun in the 1970's, Godly Play is used in many countries around the world with children, youth, and adults. It is not only used in Sunday School, but in schools, hospitals, and nursing homes. The benefits of using Godly Play with dementia patients have recently been documented. Play and God's loving grace are universal!

A MESSAGE FROM THE TREASURER

In my December 9, 2014 letter to the congregation, I referred to Jim Doherty's recently published book, Finish Up Strong, as an encouragement for all of us to assist our church in reaching its financial goal of a balance of income and expenses for the 2014 year. It was an exciting finish to the year! In the final moments, we were within \$319.23 of the goal. A family in our congregation generously donated that amount, as well as additional funds, to provide our staff with a 1.5% increase in compensation rather than a 1.0% increase. Additionally, we have been able to cover the 1.5% increase in the monthly medical dues for the children of our staff members. Hallelujah!

The operating budget for 2015 provides for income/expenses of \$492,419. Included in this income amount is \$467,816 in envelope contributions, \$2,500 in loose offering, \$9,709 for the use of our physical plant by others, \$1,250 in interest, and \$11,144.00 from the Reserve Fund. In February, I will make available to those who are interested, a copy of our budget for 2015 and a summary of our expenses for 2014. Please let me know if you are interested.


THURSDAY MID-DAY LENTEN STUDY FEBRUARY 19 – MARCH 26, 2015

In life and in death, Jesus' words were powerful and meaningful. Despite the serious effort and increased pain required for Jesus to speak as he hung on the cross, Gospel accounts attribute to him seven "final words" – statements that have much to teach us about Jesus, his Father, and ourselves:

*Father Forgive Them
Behold Your Son...Behold Your Mother
My God, Why Have You Forsaken Me?
Today You Will Be with Me in Paradise
I Thirst
It Is Finished
Into Your Hands I Commit My Spirit*

This study will explore & imagine these final words as seen and heard through the eyes and ears of those who stood near the cross. Each chapter begins with the biblical account followed by a first-person story as might have been told from the viewpoint of one of the characters at the cross. Then the chapter explores the meaning of Jesus' dying words for our lives today.


