A SEASON TO GROW

When you ask Christians what their favorite season in the church is, rarely do you ever hear anyone reply, "Lent." And it is no surprise. After all, who wants to be down-in-the-mouth for forty days in anticipation of Easter with the only bright spots being Sundays when we break to enjoy a "little Easter"?

Lent is mostly associated with giving up something, a forty day season of sacrifice when we remember how Jesus sacrificed his life for us. For many Christians, it takes the form of giving up pleasurable things.

However, you may have also heard it said that for most Christian traditions Lent is primarily a season of "taking up" something. It is a time not only of repentance and fasting, but also of evangelism and conversion – a time for *growing* through repentance, fellowship, prayer, fasting, and reflection on our baptismal covenant.

So, perhaps instead of thinking of it as a season of deprivation, we should think of it as a season to *grow* by engaging in the spiritual disciplines we see in Jesus' journey to the cross and which he commands us to take on for our life long discipleship journey so that we may know the growth God desires for us.

We begin our Lenten journey on Ash Wednesday, March 5 with a service of worship at 6:45 p.m. in the sanctuary. The season of preparation begins with penitence and awareness of our mortality. From that starting point we grow as we study, pray, and fast. For our Wednesday night series from March 12-April 9 we will offer evening prayer in the sanctuary to aid us in remembering Jesus' journey.

I also encourage you to seize the opportunities God gives us every day, moments of calm and even moments of busyness to reflect on the journey Jesus made to the cross for us and for our salvation. My hope is that these disciplines will grow in us over these forty days and so will continue to spring forth throughout Eastertide and beyond.





WE KNOW ITS LENT WHEN... WE MAKE PRETZELS AND CROSSES

The time of Lent is here, and while the children in Sunday School are focusing on prayer and what God expects of us, they journey with Jesus through his ministry and last days on earth. There is a beautiful solemnity during this time of the Church Year with:

- our more serious and spiritually introspective worship
- the way we are to look inward at our prayer life and at our relationship with Christ
- the steps we take as we walk with Jesus to his death

These are all practices that will stir great emotion and can even change our lives.

As a part of emphasizing our focus on prayer, the children in Sunday School will make –and eat – pretzels. This is a good Lenten food as pretzels are very plain and remind us of fasting. Pretzels have been made and eaten during Lent for over 1500 years. According to tradition, they were originally made by monks. Their shape suggests arms folded in prayer, which is an older posture of prayer than folded hands.


People would cross their arms over their chest while they prayed.



There are ways children, and people of all ages, can appropriately take part in the Lenten tradition of giving up something and taking on something as a discipline to help us become more loving people and help us grow closer to God.

For example:

- ♦ Give up a favorite TV program to help with a household chore.
- ♦ Give up a snack or dessert and put the money it would have cost into the church offering plate.
- ♦ Give up a favorite toy for a day so that a little brother or sister can play with it.



As another Lenten activity, the Class of the Dove (3rd-5th grades) will make palm lapel crosses for everyone in the congregation to wear during the Palm Sunday Service. The children will distribute them to everyone as they enter the sanctuary for worship on that day.

WE KNOW ITS LENT WHEN... WE ASK WHAT THE WORD LENT MEANS

Sunday School classes during Lent focus on the love that God has for us, the love that Jesus taught us, and the feeding of our bodies and souls. Love and spiritual nourishment is what Lent is all about.

"Lent" comes from the Anglo-Saxon word lencton, meaning "to lengthen", describing the time of year when the days grow longer. The time begins on Ash Wednesday and ends with the Easter Triduum (Maundy Thursday through Easter Day), covering forty days. Sundays are not included since Sundays are always a celebration of our Lord's resurrection, a "mini-Easter". The five Lenten Sundays are followed by the Sunday of the Passion (Palm Sunday), which begins Holy Week and is the last week in Lent.

In the early church, Lent was the time of preparation for the Easter baptism of converts to the faith. Persons who were to receive the sacrament of baptism - "new birth", "death to sin" - were expected to fast and prepare during those weeks.

Sunday, March 30 - In Sunday School, Godly Play in Class of the Scripture and library time in Class of the Font.



PRETZEL RECIPE

To one package of yeast, dissolved in one and one half cups of warm water, add one teaspoon of salt and one teaspoon of sugar. Blend in four cups of flour.

After kneading to mix, twist into shape (upside down "U", cross and place ends to the top). Place on a greased cookie sheet & brush with beaten egg. Sprinkle with a tiny bit of coarse (kosher) salt. Bake at 425 degrees for about 10 minutes or until lightly browned.



FLOWERING THE CROSS

In spite of its function as a brutal form of execution, the cross stands at the center of our faith as a symbol of life. There can be no Easter without Good Friday, no Resurrection without the Crucifixion. Indeed, the cross, rather than the empty tomb, has held the place of honor as the primary symbol of the Christian faith. A modern expression of this idea may be found in the custom of *flowering the cross*.

As we did last year, Tuckahoe will celebrate the *flowering of the cross* on Easter morning during the Children's Sermon. You are invited to bring fresh blooms from your gardens to help fill the cross with emblems of "new life".

In preparation for the Easter event, the cross will be placed in the sanctuary on Palm Sunday, draped in purple. On Good Friday the cross will be draped in black and a crown of thorns added. Then on Easter morning the cross will be adorned with greenery and flowers and lifted high in celebration of the Resurrection of Our Lord.


