Here's how the auction works: You purchase a ticket for \$5 (or 3 for \$10) and write your name and contact info on the back of the ticket. Then decide which items you would like to try and win; place one, or as many tickets as you want, in the corresponding jar located by the item. Anyone who places a ticket in a jar has an opportunity to win that item. During the show, we will draw one ticket from each jar to determine who wins the gift basket or donated item. Fundraiser ticket purchases are not a tax deduction (See below for an alternate tax-deductible donation method.). You can purchase tickets starting April 3rd when you make your reservation.

In addition to the tickets for the displayed items, we will also have a live auction which will take place during the show. Several items will be up for bid and will be handled by our show hosts, Robins Buck and Pat Macaulay. It will be an entertaining and exciting part of the show!

If you don't want to participate in the auction, or can't attend the event on the 14th, you can make a tax-deductible contribution to support our mission activities, using one of the yellow envelopes available at the reservation tables and at the Show. These donations will be included on your contribution statement.

FROM THE PASTOR'S STUDY

“ANOTHER BRIDGE FROM SCIENCE TO FAITH”

A big interest in my reading and thinking life is the intersection between science and religion. My dissertation has included a careful study of Michael Polanyi's works. Polanyi was a 20th century chemist who turned to philosophy late in his life. To put the theme in terms of a question, “how does science inform our lives of faith as Christians?” From Galileo and Isaac Newton of old to John Polkinghorne (Cambridge) and John Lennox (Oxford) today, the Christian faith has been well represented by eminent scientists. To repeat an old saw, the opposite of faith is not reason. The opposite of faith is *doubt*. Faith and reason go together as we chart our lives with rational planning and as we pursue our journeys of faith and service.

Yet our pundits and popular culture watchdogs seem to pit science and religion against one another frequently and thoughtlessly. I have picked up a fascinating book that surveys the historical study of science and debunks the conflict myth with compelling arguments. This 2010 (Johns Hopkins University Press) book has a mammoth title. Ready – here it is. *Never Pure: Historical Studies of Science as if It Was Produced by People with Bodies, Situated in Time, Space, Culture, and Society, and Struggling for Credibility and Authority* by Steven Shapin. Shapin is the Franklin L. Ford Professor of the History of Science at Harvard.

To pique your interest I'll summarize Shapin's argument. He declares that science, for all its authority and power, has always been a human endeavor subject to human capacities and human limits. To be human is to err. So science like poetry and historical studies and yes, even theology, has never been pure. Shapin argues that we understand science better when we recognize it as the laborious achievement of fallible, imperfect and historically situated human beings.

Sometimes I hear opponents of the theory of evolution denounce Darwin as being atheistic and godless. He actually went to Cambridge intending to train for the clergy. He claimed he wrote *Origin of the Species* as a theist. He later admitted to agnostic views but never claimed to be an atheist. He reflected on religious ideas as well as proposing scientific ones during all his years. In other words he lived self-consciously in both worlds.

We live in both worlds too. We weigh the evidence and we ponder revelation. We wonder how a man can be raised from the dead but we read Paul's stirring testimony “*that he (Jesus) was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures, and that he appeared to Peter, and then to the Twelve. After that he appeared to more than five hundred of the brothers at the same time, most of whom are still living...*” (1 Corinthians 15:5-6). And we decide what we shall believe and how our beliefs will shape our lives.

If you want to tackle a good book that helps you reflect on “science as a human endeavor” consider plunging into Shapin's collection of essays. And tell me what you think!

MAYBE YOU WOULD LIKE TO TAKE ON JUST "A PIECE" OF A HALLWAY OR ONE ROOM AS YOUR GIFT TO VBS 2013.....

Here's the new plan for "help wanted"- a.s.a.p.- to plan and carry out transforming our space for VBS:

This year's theme, "Everywhere Fun Fair - Where God's World Comes Together", has two facets. One is an overall fair theme (think red and white canopies, pennant flags, popcorn, tickets, etc.) and the other involves 5 countries - one for each day. The countries are Japan, Zimbabwe, United Kingdom, Australia, and Mexico.

We need:

- ***Fair lead and helpers** - Duntreath, stairwells, and entry hall ceiling
- ***Japan lead and helpers** - 1st half of preschool hall and portion of entry wall
- ***Zimbabwe lead and helpers** - 2nd half of preschool hall and portion of entry wall
- ***UK lead and helpers** - hall to the left of entry hall and portion of entry wall
- ***Australia lead and helpers** - front hall (leading to parlor & Duntreath) and portion of entry wall
- ***Mexico lead and helpers** - 2nd floor hall between room between room 210 and 202

The curriculum has many wonderful decorating ideas with detailed instructions for the fair theme, as well as for decorating areas to create an atmosphere for each country.

REFLECTIONS FROM THE PRESBYTERIAN WOMEN'S RETREAT, "SHARING OUR STORIES"

On Saturday, March 2, 2013, approximately fifty women and guests of Tuckahoe Church enjoyed a delightful program led by Jeannie DuBose, M.S., who is the Director of Spiritual Formation at Trinity Presbyterian Church in Atlanta and author of *The Mother Daughter Dance*. Jeannie is a nationally recognized speaker who is intrigued by stories of personal growth and witness that shape our individual and community spirituality.

The program began with a worship service, during which Ms. DuBose asked participants to pay attention to the images, themes, and stories of their lives. She encouraged us to consider what *generative* questions might be relevant to our current circumstances. Generative questions are those which lead to new or creative thinking, new knowledge, or the courage to make something happen. She closed her reflection with the comment that "we are all more interesting than we look."

A wonderful PowerPoint presentation of childhood photos of the participants and accompanying comments provided a prompt for the sharing of stories from each woman's past. Ms. DuBose's continued with a discussion of the struggle of women to know their stories, name their stories, and share them. The deeper we know who we are and can share that, the closer we come to the divine. Ms. DuBose suggested that in sharing our stories, we find common ground and a deeper connection with other people and with the Holy Spirit. In group activities, participants were asked to write five nouns which described themselves, and also to list places or situations where they felt spiritually fed, nurtured, and able to be their true selves. We found that many of our responses were similar. Most importantly, these exercises prompted everyone to begin talking, sharing their experiences and thoughts, and recounting fond memories.

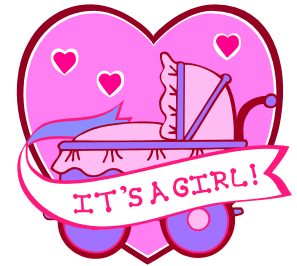
In the final session, Ms. Dubose asked participants to consider the idea that "there is growth for us with the muscles that we don't use." She encouraged those who are comfortable with talking to improve their listening skills, and vice versa.

Ms. Dubose concluded by emphasizing that just as the Bible contains both lamentations and psalms, our lives will have both sorrows and joys. It is important that we learn to experience both situations fully and to name our truths so that we can continue to move forward to new places. Our lives, like the Bible, are a continuation of the story of God's people.

A FAVORITE RECIPE FROM THE RETREAT

Ruth Anna Langdon's Marinated Green Beans

2 cups of green beans (can use 1/2 bag of Trader Joe's frozen French green beans which is more than 2 cups)

1 medium sized red onion

Dressing:

3/4 cup sugar

1/2 cup bean juice from green bean broth

4 tablespoons of vegetable oil

1/2 tsp. dried dill

3/4 cup wine vinegar

Salt and pepper

1. Cook green beans until just tender.
2. Slice onion very thinly and then cut into smaller pieces.
3. Mix dressing well and pour over beans and onion.
4. Marinate overnight.
5. Drain before serving.

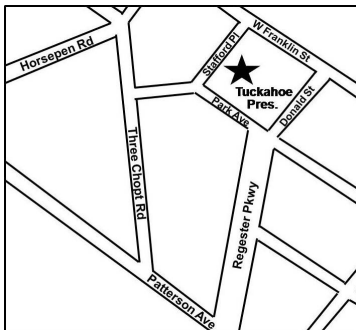
