

STOP HUNGER NOW

Stop Hunger Now is an international hunger relief agency that has been committed to ending hunger for more than 14 years. In 2005 the organization created a meal packaging program consisting of food that stores easily, has a shelf-life of five years and transports quickly. Stop Hunger Now provides over 70% of its meals to support school feeding programs, vocational training programs, early childhood development programs, orphanages, and medical clinics.

Tuckahoe will be offering an opportunity to participate in **Stop Hunger Now** on October 19, 2013. Stop **Hunger Now's** meal packaging program is a fun, hands-on international mission project where volunteers of all ages work in an assembly line to package high protein, vitamin rich meals.

In participating you will gain an awareness of global hunger and food insecurity issues across a broad cross-section of the US population.





LAMB'S BASKET UPDATE

In order to increase our donations to LAMB's Basket during the months of April and May we had the Sunday School classes bring canned goods as an offering the 2nd Sunday of the month. We would like to encourage everyone to continue with donations on the 2nd Sunday of the month. However, donations are welcome at any time. Starting in the Fall we will have a food emphasis each month so be sure to check the Torch and your weekly emails.

BRIGHT BEGINNINGS 2013 Even though most of our children are just getting out of school for the summer, it's time to start planning for Tuckahoe's participation in the YMCA's Bright Beginnings Program in August! This year, the Outreach Division has decided to try something a little dif-ferent.....we will be one of the primary sponsors of two separate shopping trips. The first will be on Tuesday, August 13th at 12:30 pm. The second will be on Thursday, August 15th at 5:30 pm. We will need 10 volunteers for each date. Please sign up early! Last year we had to turn away some of our wonder-ful shoppers, because the spaces had been filled. For those of you not familiar with the YMCA's Bright Beginnings Program, it is a 21 year old effort to provide children from low-income families with new clothes, shoes, etc. to help ensure that they start the school year off on the right foot. We need volunteers to shop with these children to help them pick out their new fall clothes. (The \$100 shopping limit is provided through community sup-port). The time commitment is about two and a half hours. This time also includes the opportunity to share a meal with your assigned child. As in the past, shoppers need to be 16 years old or older (13 through 15 year olds may shop with another adult and child). Children under 13 are asked not to attend so that the shopper can give his/her undivided attention to their assigned child in the program. If you have younger children and would like for them to participate you may consider filling a backpack with age appropriate school supplies. We will be happy to supply you with a list. One last way to help a deserving child is to make a monetary contribution to Tuckahoe Presbyterian earmarked for YMCA Bright Beginnings. Please consider sharing a moment of your time; a well filled backpack; or a monetary donation with a deserving child this summer. It's a heart warming experience you won't want to miss! TPC SECURITY CONCERNS... IT'S EVERYONE'S JOB!

In the last few weeks we have been finding doors around the Church left unlocked overnight. The middle door near the kitchen has been found unlocked 2 or 3 times and the office door left unlocked at least once. On May 1, we had an upstairs west end motion detector initiate an alarm at 4:30 am. The initiation by the motion detector is an indication that someone had entered the building. The intruder probably entered through an unlocked and unmanned door earlier in the evening before, slept in one of the classrooms, and then left when the alarm sounded.

On several occasions we have encountered homeless men in the rest room areas downstairs and the upstairs classrooms. When the doors are open, everyone needs to pay attention to the people entering the building. Since we are a small congregation, we know most of the other members and monitoring people entering the building will be effective in identifying guests and others. It is important that we try to insure no unauthorized persons remain in the building when we leave.

If you are a key holder and you unlock the door for people to enter, remember it is YOUR responsibility to insure the door is locked after the building use. Please remember that you cannot lock someone in the building – they can always exit without a key.

We have been fortunate that there has been no identified theft or damage caused by an intruder – but let's not tempt fate. Thanks in advance for your understanding and action.




ble, Target and Belk (in North Carolina). A guest book will be provided during the reception for everyone to sign and wish them a long and prosperous life together.

ARE YOU AWARE??????


.....that it is not necessary for you to have been a Deacon or an Elder in order to serve on one of our Divisions? **Every Division needs new members.**

FROM THE FELLOWSHIP DIVISION

AFTER CHURCH FELLOWSHIP GUIDELINES

Want to help out with an After Church Fellowship Hour; but, unsure what to do? Here are some helpful hints!

Keep it SIMPLE! Some suggestions:

Punch, Pretzels, Crackers/Cheese/Cheese ball, Lemonade, Goldfish crackers, Chex Mix, Chip/Dip, Nuts, Cookies/Brownies, Fruit, Veggie Straws, Veggie tray.

Please do not feel that you have to serve ALL of the above. Just pick a few items and if you should have any items leftover and would like to leave them for the next host or hostess, please wrap them up, make a note on them, put them in the freezer; and if possible, please inform the next week's host/hostess. Please check the pantry, if possible, the week prior to your date as there are many items there you may use and/or supplement your menu with: Chips, Cheezits, Lemonade mix, Nuts, Cookies, Assorted crackers, Veggie straws, Goldfish crackers, Pretzels, Plastic cups, Napkins, Plates. If you deplete an item or notice others getting low, please make a note on the clipboard hanging in the pantry. Ginger Ale and Fruit Punch can be found in the refrigerator. Please note on clipboard in pantry if either are getting low or need replenishing. Platters and dishes for plating are located in the pantry.

- 1. Please wash, dry, and return items to the pantry.
- 2. Make sure serving tables are set up in the Fellowship Hall. Having them separated and slightly angled is working very well and allows for better traffic flow.
- 3. If you rearrange any tables; please refer to the diagram on the bulletin board on the back wall near the exit door and return tables to positions in the diagram.
- 4. Tablecloths are found in the pantry; bottom shelf. Sometimes paper cloths are available in the pantry; if so, you're welcome to use them.
- 5. Centerpieces are optional. If used, please keep them simple.
- 6. Please sweep the floors in the kitchen and the Fellowship Hall.
- 7. Empty the trash cans in the kitchen and Fellowship Hall.
- 8. Place new trash liners into each trash can. These can be found in the kitchen near the side exit near the stove.
- 9. Take all trash bags to the dumpster.
- 10. Please launder all tablecloths and dish towels and return them to the church.

When worship moves to 10 AM in the summer, it is recommended to serve only punch and cookies. However, if it is your Sunday and you wish to do a little more, you have that option; however, it is not required.

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
