

OUTREACH PRAYER REQUEST OF THE MONTH

Each month the Outreach Division will be asking for your prayers for individuals in the community and/or organizations we support. APPALACHIA SERVICE PROJECT (ASP) THEME FOR THE YEAR

ASP's theme this year, is *Apostello: Life on Purpose*. The Greek word, *apostello*, is defined 'to send forth, a messenger/agent'. Using the New Testament text from

John 20:21 (NIV), "As the Father has sent me, I am sending you", the use of *apostello* aims to communicate that ASP isn't just a week in the mountains working alongside amazing families; it's a reminder that we are sent!

"Apostello" is used to describe how God sent Jesus Christ into the world, and how Jesus sends his disciples into the world. The early church even used a form of the word--apostle--to designate those 'set apart and sent' to build the Kingdom of God.



SUMMER MISSION TRIP TO KENTUCKY

On Saturday, June 21, 25 members of our Tuckahoe family will begin their weeklong mission trip, traveling to Hazard, Kentucky. The group will once again work with Appalachia Service Project.

Hazard is located in the heart of the Appalachian Coalfields in Eastern KY. It is found at the crossroads of Highways 15 and 80 and the Hal Rogers Parkway (formerly the Daniel Boone Parkway). The CBS television series <u>The Dukes of Hazzard</u> got its name from Hazard, Kentucky. To avoid legal problems, the producers added an extra "Z" and set the show in a fictional county in Georgia. This will be the third time our Outreach Division has committed to work with ASP; and their goal remains the same; to make homes warmer, safer and drier for families in need.

From the history of ASP..."By transforming faith into ASP service, volunteers respond to a specific need: housing. By putting aside their own needs and desires, ASP volunteers free themselves to share talent, love, and concern with the people of Appalachia and with one another. More important than construction know-how is a willingness to enter the communities and homes of Central Appalachia with sensitivity, concern, and love -- accepting people right where they are and just the way they are."

A few of our mission trip volunteers have not been on a TPC mission trip previously, others faithfully return annually. Some of our volunteers are very experienced at home repair projects and some are looking forward to handling a hammer for the first time. Some of our volunteers are younger and some are, well, "not younger". As 25 mission team volunteers prepare to depart, many more mission trip volunteers remain right here at home; to offer prayers on our behalf, to assist in trip preparations and to share equipment and supplies. It is an exciting time of year for our church; the Holy Spirit can be witnessed working among our congregation. The congregation answers the call to come together and work to be the heart, voice, hands and feet of Christ to bring needed service to our brothers and sisters in Kentucky.

Please be partners with us in prayer, in joining us for our commissioning on Sunday, June 8, at the TPC worship service, and in your enthusiastic, prayerful support.

Inspired by a true story, *Caleb's Crossing* captures the triumphs and turmoil of two brave, open-hearted spirits who risk everything in a search for knowledge at a time of superstition and ignorance.



NEW HYMNALS ENRICH WORSHIP AT TUCKAHOE!

As Moderator of the Worship and Membership Division, I often hear comments about our new hymnal. Members feel free to tell me what they think, as they are encouraged

to do. But first let me briefly share some background information for our new members.

Our former hymnal was more than 20 years old and in need of a "freshening." Many of those hymns were familiar and loved. A special PC(USA) music committee decided to keep them. And there were hymns, "old standards," that had been excluded from that hymnal. Many of those, theologically sound and uplifting, were brought back! But as our Living God continues to inspire contemporary, gifted hymn writers, the committee included some of their hymns that bring us closer to God's Spirit around and within us.

Some members' comments: "It warms my heart" (an "old standard"). "I have always felt closer to God when our church sings this" (a communion hymn we retained from our "Blue" hymnal). "So moving! I didn't want the hymn to end" and "It speaks to me today in my challenges" (about two contemporary hymns). And about another new hymn that the choir sang as a response, "It took me someplace I didn't expect, a wonderful place!"

I have also heard that a couple of newer hymns are "challenging" (meaning "the tune was not at all familiar, so I really needed to pay attention to the music and to those who sing around me.") But the second time around the hymn shouldn't be quite as "challenging."

Hymns connect us to one another across generations as we sense the echoes of joy from the voices of our great, great grandparents. Hymns connect us worldwide today across different cultures. That same God remains loving and faithful to us all, and under our God and our Lord, we are one, whether years or miles apart.

What a reason to be grateful! Let me suggest that you join me in dedicating a new hymnal, perhaps to celebrate an event like ours (our daughter's graduation), or for a special person in your life whom you want to honor or memorialize or, simply to the Glory of God.

Your \$25 dedication or memorial goes into our Music Fund to be used in ways that will bring you and all of us closer to God and to one another. Your donation is a "win-win" in ways you cannot imagine, but God can. The Worship and Membership Division humbly thanks you.


