#### FROM THE PASTOR'S STUDY



#### **GLIMPSES**

Do you ever wish you could get a glimpse into your future? When I was a child, I often wondered what my life would be like when I became an adult. I remember telling my mother when I was about six, that I wanted to be a doctor and would marry a woman with red hair. I recall pondering where I would live, if I would get married, and other such things.

As children our minds are full of possibilities. As we get older and near the middle of our lives, we may begin to wonder what it would be like to get a glimpse into the end of our lives. Will we

remain relatively healthy or contract a prolonged illness? Will our children be faithful Christians as adults or lapse in the faith and stray away from the church? Will they have successful and stable lives or will they be full of hardship and pain? Will we die before our spouses or children or outlive them?

Well, none of us can get a glimpse into our future lives and the best we can hope for is that God, who has been faithful to us in our past, will continue to be faithful into our future. Which brings us to Advent. You hear every year that "Advent" means "coming." And what is coming has in one respect already come – Jesus was born – his first coming over two thousand years ago. The Old Testament prophecies that were foretold have in part been fulfilled. We now stand in the middle age (some say it might be closer to the end) and wonder what his second coming might be like. We look toward the unknown

future with as much uncertainty as to when Jesus will return as we do to when we will take our final breath.

If only we could get a glimpse into that future, to see how it will all play out, if only.... Fortunately (or some might say unfortunately) we do get glimpses. Scripture gives us mixed images of pain, darkness and war as well as pleasure, light and peace. Some of us may consider the future cause for concern, the end as something to fear. And yet, the total witness of Scripture shows us a God whose breaking into the human scene is often preceded by "Do not fear...I bring you good news of great joy!" If this was God's announcement of his coming to earth in the form of Jesus in the past, maybe this is how God will come in the future. It may be God uses this season as the days grow shorter and the light fades more quickly to remind us that the darkest night is just before the dawn, and that the second coming of Jesus will not be full of fear, but assurance, as he lights people up with great joy.

In this Advent season of worship, we are going to be afforded *glimpses of joy* as we examine the prophecy of Isaiah 35. We live in a culture that fears the future more than it longs for it. The questions of wonder in a child full of hope and expectation become fear-laden questions about loss, suffering and sorrow as one ages. That is an inescapable reality of our mortality. And yet, God in Jesus Christ encourages us to look to the future with hope and joy, trusting that Jesus is coming with healing and peace, to bring us to everlasting joy. This is the promised future of our redeemed lives, eternal in Christ. So in this season, Blessings,

come and get glimpses of joy.

#### WHAT IS ADVENT?

What is all this about, this "getting ready" for Christmas? Is it "black Friday" shopping at five o'clock in the morning? Buying the tree, decorating the door? Sending the cards? Buying that dancing Santa that sings to us each time we go into the drugstore?

We all know the answer, as we prayerfully try to look past the worldly surroundings and distractions. With the First Sunday of Advent this year on November 30, it is time to be sure we know why Advent should mean so much and how we can be fully true to that meaning. Knowing "the whys" is important for us in striving to lead Christian lives, as well as in setting examples in word and deed to the children in our lives.

The four-week time of Advent begins a new church year and prepares us for the celebration of the birth of our Savior, Jesus Christ. During the Sundays in Advent, familiar symbols and lectionary scripture readings bring us "the bad news and the good news". On the one hand, they sharpen our sense of unworthiness and need for redemption. On the other, they stir in us an eager expectation for the coming of our promised Savior.

Advent's somber side reflects its message of repentance: "Prepare to meet your Maker!" Advent's joyful side reflects its message of grace: "Prepare to receive God's gift - Himself!" Preparation for the commercial/secular side of Christmas time usually means hectic planning and much activity. But Advent's preparation for Jesus' birthday means time out and quiet moments. "Christmas preparation" may be a dreaded burden with high emotional expectations that are seldom met. But Advent's preparation is God's work, cleansing our minds, setting our hearts at peace, and fulfilling our inmost longings.


And so, let us take this time to know Advent – to reflect on what it is about and to share that reflection with our children and grandchildren– so that we can experience the true preparation in our hearts and minds as we near the mysterious celebration of the birth of Our Lord, and prepare for His coming again. This Advent, let God speak to you and satisfy your need for deeply felt celebration. Additionally, let us be sure the children in our lives know "the hows and whys" of living a faithful and appropriate Advent, both by explanation and by example.

May we keep in mind and savor the fact that celebrating Christmas goes on for twelve days! The Twelve Days of Christmas begin on Christmas Day and continue until Epiphany on January 6<sup>th</sup>! We can hold Advent fully in our hearts and lives, and then joyfully embrace all that is Christmas during every minute of those twelve days!

#### LIBERATION FAMILY SERVICES

For many years dedicated members of our Tuckahoe congregation prepared meals for families and individuals in the care and service of Freedom House Community Shelter. In May of 2013 financial challenges became insurmountable for Freedom House and they closed their doors.

Liberation Family Services was gifted with the ability to acquire Freedom House and their building at 1201 Hull St. on Richmond's Southside. Liberation Family Services has continued Freedom House's 30-year mission of providing food, shelter and the power to change for individuals in crisis.

"LFS is fortunate that we were in a position where we could assume the programs within the scope of our original mission."

Today, Liberation Family Services (LFS) is focused on serving homeless veterans. Their primary goal is permanent housing and self-sufficiency for the veterans. Their transitional housing program provides an opportunity for the veterans to receive the services and support they need to rebuild their lives. A member of the staff at LFS recently reached out to our Outreach Division to ask if we could commit to any of their available dates to provide dinner for the residences at their facility. While there is support within our Outreach Division to help support LFS and the veterans they assist, we, as a division, are looking to the congregation for your support.

That support will be in the form of a cooking team to help feed these service men. Twelve to fourteen members are needed to form a cooking team. We can provide dinner anywhere from 3 – 6 days in a 6 month period. The dates and number of times a year is still to be determined based on support.




# ANNUAL MEETING SCHEDULED FOR FEBRUARY 8, 2015




