While the Chiefs and the Eagles battle it out on the field, we'll have our own friendly competition to predict the winner and support those in need. Beginning next Sunday, on February 9, 16, 23, and March 2, from 9:15 - 10:15 Sunday mornings, you are invited to join the Adult Sunday School Classes in Room 106 (new location) for a 4-part Pre-Lent Series on the Holocaust led by Hal Breitenberg: Christians, Churches, and the Holocaust. Hal, an ordained minister in the PC(USA) and a parish associate at TPC, has his M.Div. and Ph.D. from Union Presbyterian Seminary and is an associate professor of Religious Studies at Randolph-Macon College, where he teaches courses about religion and culture, including a course on the Holocaust he has taught for over 20 years. The series will focus on the Holocaust and its importance for Christians and the church. Topics to be explored include: antisemitism; why Jews were targeted by Nazi Germany, its allies and collaborators; other victim groups; responses to Nazi rule by Protestant churches and the Catholic Church; involvement of the SS and others in murdering Jews during the "Holocaust by bullets;" and the role of death camps. We will learn why the Holocaust is not just a topic for Jews, and why it is especially important for Christians to know about the Holocaust.

Warinner Family Scholarship Fund - It's time to apply for the Warinner Family Scholarship. It's amazing to think that 11 members of Tuckahoe have already received grants! The fund was established in 2013 in memory of long-time members Ned and Shirley Warinner and Susan Hogg (their daughter). The scholarship provides up to \$1500/year for up to 4 years. Recipients must be ages 18-26 and active in the life of Tuckahoe Presbyterian Church (please note that students already in college or graduate school may be considered; anyone eligible is encouraged to apply).
